From Our Area Chair

Dear Colorado Al-Anon Family



It is with eternal gratitude that I say thank you for sending me to the 2025 WSC (World Service Conference)! That was truly a wonderful experience that I can't wait to share with you all at the Summer Assembly in Grand Junction. For now, I'll say that I keep building up these meetings, like SWRDM (Southwest Regional Delegates Meeting) and WSC as major events in my mind as if I were entering a sacred space and they kind of are, but also, they're truly just larger and more intensive Assemblies. That is not by mistake though as our assemblies are modeled after the WSC, but they take the guidelines/rules way more seriously at WSC and I found myself in awe of the process at multiple points. There were a few moments when people were discussing issues, policies, and sharing their stories where I must admit I did not feel worthy enough to be attending the event. I was the youngest delegate in the room, but not by THAT much with the second youngest at 40. Yet, I kept asking myself what made me qualified to be serving at such a level, to be representing an entire area of members? Multiple times I had to stop and pray for serenity from my selfdoubt and remind myself that I was elected in the Area process, just like every other Delegate and we all had been brought to these points by our higher powers for a reason. I spoke to a few delegates about these feelings as their service resumes were longer than mine and many of them had served as Area Chairs, Treasurers, Secretaries, and/or Alt-Delegates before considering standing for Delegate. I went from DR straight to Delegate and that made feel somehow, less worthy, yet I did find other Delegates who took the same path as me and even some with less years in the program. After bonding with members from across North America I must say I felt I was a respected equal member at the conference and no matter what the disease said, I was there with my primary purpose to serve Al-Anon.

To that end, I was frequently at the microphone and making a name for myself quoting the Service manual and asking specific and pointed questions. I voted in ways that I believed benefited our Area, but also Al-Anon as a whole. There's a lot to discuss at Assembly, and I am eager to start working on my presentation, props, and workshop to convey the messages from WSO as I am your conduit of information. I hope and will keep praying that I can find a balance on condensing four twelve-hour business days into my two-hour report in July. Until then, I hope to continue to work my program so I may keep my serenity to best serve you all. Thank you for your time reading my piece and the Butterfly as it's a wonderful magazine that our area is truly blessed to have.

Four books were donated as giveaways: Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships; Opening our Hearts Transforming our Losses; Discovering Choices Recovery in Relationships; and The Al-Anon Family Groups Classic Edition. After a delicious variety of potluck foods were enjoyed by members the workshop was started.

As Colorado Area Literature/Forum Coordinator, I facilitated the Forum Writing Workshop. I created a "project board" that displayed the Al-Anon Guidelines (G-11), the Forum Information and tips for GRs as Forum Representatives (F-2), The Forum Writing Guideline (F-1), The Forum Subscription Order Form, the information sheet "Share your experience, strength and hope - in writing!" and a copy of the Forum. Journals of lined paper between colorful acrylic painted vinyl were made by workshop committee members, Holly, Pat, and Julie. Different monthly Forums were placed on the tables as well. We went through the different parts of the Forum to familiarize ourselves. Most groups subscribed to the Forum. Very few individuals subscribed. I encouraged members to subscribe and submit their writing. From The Forum, May 2025

Before Al-Anon I trusted everyone and no one. How could that be? I had no boundaries, so I blabbed and complained to anyone who would listen. Yet, I didn't share with those who mattered in my life, because I might be questioned and held accountable. I rarely let anyone see who I really was.

My husband had an affair the summer before I started attending Al-Anon. I allowed myself to be manipulated. I believed the lies I was told and convinced myself that what I saw and heard was wrong. After discovering the truth, I had all kinds of suspicions and trust issues. Coming to Al-Anon changed that.

Honestly, after reading <u>Step One</u>, I recognized that my life was unmanageable. I realized that without boundaries, I couldn't trust anyone, especially myself. So, I kept coming back and started to work on myself.

I continued to go to meetings and got a Sponsor. I began to learn who I was and how fear controlled my life. I learned trust from my Sponsor. She also showed me that my Higher Power has my best interests at heart. She helped me to see how many times I had been taken care of and to believe I would continue to be. I began to trust my Higher Power. I started to feel safe, and I could talk myself down from the ledge of suspicion. Today, when I feel suspicious, I check to see whether I have distorted perceptions and whether fear plays a role. Trust is a decision I can make because I know I am not alone. I rely on my Higher Power.

The Value of Sharing Our Experience

Before Al-Anon, I thought the loving thing to do when anyone shared their problems with me was to offer them my best advice about how to fix whatever the problem was. Whether I had any expertise related to their problem or not, I would eagerly tell the person what I thought they should do. Solutions popped around in my mind like popcorn kernels in a kettle of hot oil.

When I got to my first Al-Anon meeting and heard the guidelines for sharing—something about not giving advice and speaking from our own experience—I wondered how anyone was going to get the help they needed. More than that, I wondered how I was going to get the help I needed if no one there could tell me what to do.

Fittingly, the name of my home group was "Listen and Learn." As members shared their experiences, I recognized my own and felt relief that I was not alone. As they shared the tools and spiritual principles that helped them navigate their various alcoholic family situations and personal challenges, I learned that I could use those same tools and apply those same principles to my life.

I found more of this valuable experience, strength, and hope in the pages of our Conference Approved Literature (CAL). There were even indexes where I could look up specific topics! Al-Anon literature is the source of help that it is not because it advises or tells members what to do, but because it is made up of the lived experiences of our members. Reading about the myriad ways Al-Anon members apply our Legacies and program principles gives me resources, options, and most of all, hope for dealing with the effects of the family disease of alcoholism.

In 2023, the World Service Conference (WSC) approved the development of a new piece of literature on PERSONAL AND SERVICE SPONSORSHIP (working title) focusing on members' personal stories. In 2024, the WSC approved the development of a piece of literature about how members apply Al-Anon principles to their relationship with finances. The World Service Office (WSO) is currently seeking sharings for the FINANCES IN AL-ANON RECOVERY piece (working title) and the PERSONAL AND SERVICE SPONSORSHIP piece. (Visit alanon.org/sharing to see the detailed writing guides for each and to submit online.)

Additionally, WSO Staff will be conducting writing workshops at the 2025 A.A. International Convention with Al-Anon and Alateen participation in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, July 3–6, 2025. Writing workshops will be offered in English and Spanish and will focus on the new CAL as well as on writing about the Legacies and writing for our magazines.

Thanks to Al-Anon, I no longer blurt out advice or tell other people what to do. I can tell you, though, that sharing my experience in writing, whether for *The Forum* or another piece of CAL in development, has enriched my recovery. In sharing my experience, strength, and hope, I always receive far more than I give.



